Staffordshire County Council have launched a "Don't Give Up Now" campaign. We are all asked to keep following the guidelines, get tested twice a week and to book a vaccination when we're offered one.

3. Ensure everyone is advised to clean their hands thoroughly and more often than usual.
4. Ensure good respiratory hygiene for everyone by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
5. Maintain enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often using standard products, such as detergents.
6. Consider how to minimise contact across the site and maintain social distancing wherever possible.
7. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
8. Ensure individuals wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) where necessary.
9. Promote and engage in asymptomatic testing, where available.
10. Promote and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process.
11. Manage and report confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community.
12. Contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice.

DEFERRED INSET DAY

The school cancelled the Inset day which was to be taken on 29th January 2021 in order to stay open for key worker and vulnerable children. In line with government guidance, I have consulted with the chair of governors and have identified when this day will now be taken. This teacher training day will now be taken on **Wednesday 21st July 2021**. The final day for pupils will therefore be Tuesday 20th July 2021.

Collection at end of day

All parents and carers are reminded - wait patiently as children are dismissed. We can only send one child at a time, while the teacher records the adult collecting. Please be clear that this is to satisfy safeguarding requirements and to ensure ALL children go home safely. Parents are asked NOT TO QUEUE OFF MARLBOROUGH ROAD OR WILNECOTE LANE as this is blocking the flow of local traffic. Thank you.

Hot Weather

Now that the weather is warmer please remember to send your child in with a suitable hat to wear at playtimes.

Please ensure that on hot/sunny days you apply cream BEFORE YOUR CHILD COMES TO SCHOOL. Do not send children to school with bottles of sun cream. We are not allowed to apply sun cream for children.

Children need to have had their hay fever medication before they come in to school and bring a water bottle with them.

Unless there is a medical reason, children should not be bringing sunglasses into school. Please ensure all belongings are named and labelled. Thank you

Clean Air Day 2021

Happy Clean Air Day 2021



Today is National Clean Air Day and here in Staffordshire we are doing our bit to try and help make the air you breathe cleaner and healthier.

Could you give YOUR car the day off?

Did you know:

- 1/3 of ALL car journeys in Staffordshire are less than 2 miles, they could easily be substituted by sustainable travel
- idling cars pump out about 150 balloons worth of harmful gas every minute!
- poor air quality is responsible for 500 deaths in Staffordshire every year
- that idling is the single biggest contributor to poor air pollution outside schools
- 30% of all asthma cases in children are down to air pollution

The Big Bee Challenge

Our bees are in trouble! The bee population across the UK has decline significantly in recent years. Bees help to pollinate three quarters of the plants that produce 90% of the world's food!. A third of the world's food production depends on bees, i.e. every third spoonful of food depends on pollination.



Now the bees need our help:

The Big Bee Challenge is Radio 2's brand new competition for kids, in partnership with the Royal Horticultural Society. It's a fun and creative way to learn more about bees and other insects that help provide much of the food we eat, and are essential for a healthy environment. If you are between the ages of 6 and 12, we want you to design a bright, buzzy garden that will attract bees and other pollinating insects. The winner's design will be built by the RHS at an NHS Trust site which is used by children and young people with mental health needs.

The lucky winner will be invited to open the garden at an outside broadcast of [The Zoe Ball Breakfast Show](#) on Friday 20 August 2021! You will meet loads of guests, receive a professional illustration of your garden design and go home with a box of goodies to help turn your own outside space into a wonderland for bees. Each shortlisted finalist will also receive an array of bee themed goodies. It's super simple to enter. Download our garden design entry form and paint, sketch or draw a gorgeous garden.

Think about the plants that bees love. Remember bees also get thirsty and they need a safe place to rest and lay their eggs. And don't forget to include a place for hospital patients, staff and visitors to sit (humans!). Then write 3-5 sentences telling us more about your design and why you want to help the bees.


