## **Addressing Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)**

I have placed an information poster on the parent's section of the website. It concerns ACEs. Can I ask you all to take the time to read it, to process the information and reflect and think?

The uncertainty, negativity, trauma and anxiety caused by even low level abuse, neglect and not having the right home environment is proven now in the damage it causes to a child's development.

I urge you again to:

- Make routine
- Talk to your child positively
- Celebrate their success
- Love them unconditionally
- IF YOU CAN, read a few pages with your child at bedtime
- Have a calm home
- Limit or prevent shouting, arguments, hitting etc

It's all hard work. I certainly did not and do not get it right each day as a parent!! But each day is a chance to start again. Look into your child's face. Look at the endless possibility for goodness, development and growth. Never forget the way that child depends on your stability, calmness and being positive.

**Thank you for your efforts to get these things right for your child as they grow.**

## School Meal Prices from Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022

We regret to inform you in these difficult times that the School Meal Prices will increase from £2.34 per meal to £2.57 per meal from Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Please see attached to the Newsletter a letter from Chartwells Schools (our catering provider) explaining the increase.

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to be able to have a Free School Meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM). Pupils who are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) will continue to be able to have a Free School Meal.

If you feel your child/children may be entitled to Free School Meals but you have not applied then see the information on Pupil Premium/Free School Meals section (dropdown heading under Parents Information) on the school website. You can also ask any member of the Office Staff in strict confidence for assistance. This is particularly important if your child is in Year 2 this year receiving a Free School Meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) but not entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) at present as from September 2022 you will have to pay for meals taken in school.

## Supervision by parents

It has been brought to our attention that some children are playing, unsupervised on and around the school grounds of a morning. Please be aware that this is potentially a safeguarding issue in regards to accidents and also an opportunity for children to get into trouble. Please consider the danger and ensure you are there and are supervising your children at all times on the way to school and on the school grounds BEFORE 8.50am. Thank you.

### **Hot Weather**

Now that the weather is warmer please remember to send your child in with a suitable hat to wear at playtimes. Please ensure that on hot/sunny days you apply sun cream BEFORE YOUR CHILD COMES TO SCHOOL. Do not send children to school with bottles of sun cream. We are not allowed to apply sun cream for children.

Children need to have had their hay fever medication before they come in to school and should bring a water bottle with them. Unless there is a medical reason, children should not be bringing sunglasses into school. Please ensure all belongings are named and labelled.

### **Ukraine - Humanitarian crisis situation**

The March For Ukraine Campaign has been set up in Tamworth to collect essential supplies for refugees. It involves numerous organisations that includes Heart of Tamworth and The Parish of St. John the Baptist. They are helping as members of the organising group, collecting supplies, being a delivery centre and some transport. They are strictly only collecting new or nearly new items from the following list: Nappies, wipes, children's colouring books and pencils/crayons. Large blankets and sleeping bags. First aid items. Protein bars, baby food pouches (without milk or meat), sterilising tablets and dried food (pasta, rice, tea, biscuits etc). New nests, socks and pants. Toiletries. Donations can be dropped off at Sacred Heart Church.



### **Living with Covid**

The Government recently announced their Covid 19 response "Living with Covid-19" strategy for England. It means that most of the measures in place to prevent the spread of the virus are no longer required.

**National guidance now urges us all to take personal responsibility so that our actions minimise the risks of transmission.**

In school we will continue to:

- Offer frequent and proper handwashing for staff and pupils
- Encourage good respiratory hygiene - this includes continuing to follow "catch it, bin it, kill it"
- Have additional cleaning of major touch points
- Have additional ventilation

### **IMPORTANT**

**Get the basic principles of virus controls done well as part of your behaviour.**

**The spread of ALL variants will be reduced by:**

- Limiting your mixing
- Keeping your distance
- Good hand, nose and mouth hygiene
- Good ventilation

## SYMPTOM MANAGEMENT ADVICE

### UPDATED FROM 1ST APRIL 2022 ONWARDS

- Staff or pupils who are unwell, particularly with a fever or high temperature, **SHOULD STAY OFF SCHOOL** until they are feeling well and temperature has returned to normal.
- It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for Covid unless directed to by a health professional.
- Pupils who do test positive, after following direction to take a test by the NHS or GP, **SHOULD NOT ATTEND SCHOOL FOR 3 DAYS** (This is the day of the test plus 3 clear days). After the 3 days they should continue to stay off/away until they are feeling well and temperature is back to normal.
- Adults who test positive **SHOULD NOT ATTEND SCHOOL FOR 5 DAYS** ((This is the day of the test plus 5 clear days). After the 5 days they should continue to stay off/away until they are feeling well and temperature is back to normal.
