New isolation guidance for schools

Since the last update, the guidance regarding isolation and testing has changed. Now, pupils can return to school on day 7, provided they have had two negative lateral flow tests on day 6 and 7, and these tests have been carried out 24 hours apart.









Testing

Please continue with regular Lateral Flow Testing (LFT) twice a week wherever possible, although we understand nationally there are ongoing issues with the supply of LFTs. From 11 January in England, people who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results

for coronavirus will be required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test. THIS IS WHERE THERE ARE <u>NO</u> SYMPTOMS.

This is a temporary measure while COVID-19 rates remain high across the UK. Whilst levels of COVID-19 are high, the vast majority of people with positive LFD results can be confident that they have COVID-19.

Lateral flow tests are taken by people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms.

PCR Tests

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and take a PCR test. They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test - these rules have not changed. Staffing Shortages

Given the unprecedented current spread of Omicron, I want to say clearly that we will be doing everything to keep children in school wherever possible, while it remains safe to do so in terms of staffing levels.

Previously I have each week recorded numbers of staff absent in a week. Be aware that a number of teachers are already off isolating due to Covid. There is likely to be continuing shortages over the weeks ahead. This is bound to cause disruption.

A range of approaches will be taken to cover absence. Please understand that absences cause a greater load of work for all staff in school covering for absent colleagues. Thank you.,

Attendance

Further to the email sent to all parents on Monday 22nd November 2021. Please assist by:

- Not taking holidays in term-time, no period of leave for holiday can be authorised
- Only request a leave of absence when absolutely necessary
- Book routine appointments where possible outside of school times
- Not taking time off school for minor ailments ask yourself if you would stay off work for the same
- Be on time for school lateness disrupts the start of the day for your child and many key interventions take place in the first few minutes of the day
- Remember there are 175 non-school days per year, plenty of time for holidays, visits, days out and routine appointments

The application system opened on 1^{st} November 2021 for September 2022 Reception places. If you/a family member/friend have a child of school age in September 2022, please make sure applications are submitted. You cannot be allocated a space unless you have applied, this includes brothers and sisters of children ALREADY here at St. Gabriel's <u>AND</u> children who attend St. Gabriel's Pre School. It is important that you select St. Gabriel's as your 1^{ST} <u>CHOICE</u>.

Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission are re-visiting Staffordshire to review our Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Services between 18 – 20 January 2022.

The visit follows on from a 'Local Area Review' that took place in November 2018 which highlighted some strengths as well as some areas that needed improvement.

The main concern was that different parts of the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities system (including education, health and care) did not work together or with families well enough.

In response to this, we worked together, with our partners to develop a <u>Written Statement of Action</u> to drive the improvements we all wanted to see. The revisit will evaluate how effectively we have made these changes.
